At last, the birds are singing, the daffs and tulips are out, the cherry blossoms are a feast for the eyes, and it's time to think of where you're going next! Even after a lifetime of travelling, I still can't look at a map without yearning to be off. If I don't go anywhere, after a while I feel like a fish out of water. According to several travel publications, more Canadians will be travelling abroad this year than ever. Shouldn't you be one of them?

You may find less expensive tours than mine, but you can be certain they won't include as much, and you won't have as much fun as you will with us. To join one of our tours, you need a young heart, a sense of humour, and a spirit of adventure. That's all there is to it. Safari Studio, Collette Vacations, and I will take care of the rest. My tours have

limited space, so it's best to book as soon as you decide on a trip.

When posting details about my September tour of **Turkey** on my website, I originally listed it as fifteen days, when it should have been thirteen. I apologize for this mistake. Regardless, it remains a worthwhile tour at a reasonable price. In fact, it's a real bargain. Although I've never been to Greece, people who've been both there and to Turkey say the latter has more for the international traveller to see (such as the temple in ancient Ephesus, pictured at right). I've been to Turkey twice, and love its extraordinary sights. Please call Collette Vacations right away for a brochure, as the early-bird discount of \$100 per person has been extended to April 30. We're watching the conflict in neighbouring Syria very carefully, and hope and expect it will be resolved before we leave for Turkey.



**Namibia** is one of the most exciting tourist destinations on Earth. Like neighbouring South Africa, it's often referred to as a land of contrasts, with expansive deserts as well as rivers and game-filled plains. Namibia appeals to photographers and journalists because there's so much to see and write about, including the San Bushmen (pictured at right), who are genetically closest to the world's first modern humans. A trip to Namibia is guaranteed to be one of the most thrilling chapters in your life. You'll know what I mean when you come with us in November. When you call for a brochure, be sure to ask about the six-day extension to **Madagascar**, another of the world's most intriguing places.





On my recent trip to **Costa Rica**, we went white-water rafting, ate lots of fresh melon, pineapple, and papaya, hiked in the jungle, and saw toucans, herons, hummingbirds, two-toes sloths, river otters, and white-faced caphuchin monkeys. In between, we relaxed on white sandy beaches. I enjoyed myself so much that I'm taking another tour there in early December. Although I love Christmas, as it's family time, I hate the commercial hype that leads up to it. If you're like me, plan to join this tour. We've negotiated a great deal, *and* there's an early-bird discount of \$100 if you book by June 8. We'll be back a full ten days before Christmas, leaving ample time to shop and prepare for the festivities. Imagine how much you'll enjoy the holidays when you've just been swimming in the warm waters of the Pacific!

January is the green season in southern Africa, the summer rains a time of plenty. For many species, it's time to bring young into the world.

On my last trip to **Botswana** we hit the jackpot, going from one extraordinary scene to another. We saw a female hyena playing with her pups, got very close to four handsome male lions and a lioness suckling her cubs, and enjoyed the sight of a leopard playing with her adolescent son. January is the green season in southern Africa, the summer rains a time of plenty. The mammals are fat and healthy, and for many species it's time to bring young into the world. The bush is an emerald green, dotted with flowers and migrant birds that arrive by the hundreds. I'm looking forward to my next trip there, in January. We've negotiated a special price of \$9,880, including all taxes (including departure taxes and fuel surcharges), so it's a great bargain. To qualify, you have to purchase the complete tour package—both air and land arrangements. Because we'll take Air Canada and South African Airways to Johannesburg via London, we'll qualify for frequent-flyer points, as both airlines are members of Star Alliance. Space on this tour is limited to 12 participants, and my last Botswana safari was fully booked six months before departure, so don't delay. And why not consider extending the trip in Cape Town or **Mozambique?** The latter is becoming increasingly popular for its sun-drenched coastline and uncrowded beaches.

A number of people have been urging me to lead a tour to **India**, and it's time to go back. The subcontinent has many famous landmarks besides the Taj Mahal—ancient forts, temples, and castles, tiger safaris, sacred cows, working donkeys, camels, and elephants, and the erotic sculptures of Khajuraho are just a few. If you book this tour by the end of June you'll get an early-bird discount of \$250. Be sure to ask for details about our three-night (two-day) pre-tour extension to **Dubai**, where you can sail an Arabian *dhow*, ride a camel into the desert, and shop as much as you like. The extension is just \$650 plus the airfare for the diversion.

**Uganda** is a popular safari destination, and for good reason. It has fine accommodations, large concentrations of game, the most birds in all of Africa, and an abundance of primates, including cheeky chimps and shy mountain gorillas. Of course, not everyone wants to see gorillas in their natural habitat (and pay a fee for the privilege, directly benefitting gorilla conservation), though most international visitors are glad to do so. You may be more interested in seeing the flocks of pelicans and cormorants that mingle unconcernedly with hippos along the watercourses. Travel author Phillip Briggs—a tour leader who, like me, has travelled extensively off Africa's beaten track—describes Uganda, with its magnificent green hills, as one of the most underrated countries in Africa. Melissa at Safari Studio is mad about the place. Call her for details and advice about our March tour.






I lived and worked in **New Zealand** (pictured at upper right) during my itinerant wanderings in the 1960s. I'd gladly have settled there, if I hadn't moved to beautiful BC. I've been back several times, leading tours, and I'm anxious to return in April of 2013. A world traveller who tries to describe New Zealand is apt to paint an extraordinary picture: it has the unspoiled wilderness of Canada, beaches that rival Hawaii's, fjords like Norway's, and mountains like Switzerland's. Its towns and villages will make you think of England, and its lush green meadows will remind you of Ireland. Enough said. Call for a brochure, and get your name on the list!

Europe is a place I miss when I haven't been for a while. I spent the first twelve years of my life in England and most of my teen years in Germany. I especially like the fact that each European country is so different from the others. Travelling there is a continual learning experience. I enjoyed last September's trip to the great cities of **central and eastern Europe** so much that I'm repeating it in May of 2013. We'll stay in comfortable, well-situated hotels and experience sights that will be etched into your memory forever, including the heartbreaking Auschwitz as well as masterpieces of western art and culture (such as the German sculptures at right).

Our June 2013 tour of **Ireland** will include some of the most beautiful scenery anywhere, as well as quaint villages, ancient castles, and traditional pubs. As a young soldier in Northern Ireland, I spent nearly 18 months in Ballykinler, a wind-swept peninsula overlooking Dundrum Bay and the Mourne Mountains. My duties as an adventure-training instructor involved hiking, canoeing, sailing, and kayaking. I spent as much of my spare time as possible enjoying the fresh air and scenery, exploring back roads, villages, lakes, and the sand







dunes of Tyrella beach. I got to visit Belfast a lot, and Dublin once or twice. Ireland holds many happy memories for me, and I want to see it again. Why not join me?

You'll experience sights that will be etched into your memory forever, including the heartbreaking Auschwitz as well as masterpieces of western art and culture.

**FUTURE TOURS**—I'm listing my proposed tours as far ahead as possible, to help you plan. Although they're subject to change, I expect them to operate as scheduled. Book early! I'm planning tours to China and Tibet in September of 2013, Kenya and Tanzania in October, and Morocco in November. 
