### Dear Fellow Traveller:

On *60 Minutes* the other night I saw an intriguing interview with Dereck Joubert and Beverly Joubert, a Botswana couple who produce remarkable wildlife documentaries. Their specialty is lions. In Botswana, like everywhere else in Africa, lions are gradually disappearing, due to poaching and loss of habitat. Today there are only 20,000 lions in the wild, compared to 450,000 a hundred years ago. There are even fewer rhinos, which are gravely endangered. This emphasizes what I've been trying to get across for thirty years: the time to go to Africa is now! Unless this awful trend is somehow miraculously reversed, some of the African species we take for granted will vanish.

I've not met the Jouberts, but from time to time we come across documentary filmmakers while we're on safari. Last month we watched Jeremy Clarkson and his crew from the UK television series *Top Gear* filming against a backdrop of hippos in the Mara River. All of these filmmakers help create public awareness of this dire situation. Although we'll never again see the great numbers of wild animals I knew as a young man, I take the view that the more people know about it, the greater our chances of resolving this manmade dilemma.

I'm recently back from another outstanding trip to Kenya and Tanzania. There were so many highlights! We caught the great migration of wildebeest and zebra, one of the natural wonders of the world, as we always do in October. We also saw 56 lions, including a mating pair and many young.

We spent our last night at the famous Norfolk Hotel in Nairobi, a stately place referred to by just about everyone in the know as the best hotel in town. Next door is the main police station—a place I got to know many years ago. In the early 1960s, during my marathon world odyssey, I was often hard up. One night, after spending ten unbearably hot and humid days in the uncomfortable deck class on a Nile steamer, sharing my limited space with semi-naked Dinka tribesmen and their chickens and goats, and then hitchhiking through Sudan and Uganda into Kenya, I arrived in Nairobi, tired and just about broke. I stopped at the police station to see if I could leave my backpack there while I searched for a reasonably priced place to stay. The duty sergeant invited me to spend the night for free—in a cell! Though it was a little unusual, I was only too pleased to accept the offer.

It was March of 1963, I was 24 years old, and though I didn't know it, this was the beginning of my love affair with Africa. Nowadays I stay in fine hotels, but I often think back on that night in the Nairobi jail cell. It's memories like this that make travelling so rewarding.

On returning home from this last trip, I was delighted to get some of the best reviews I've received during my lengthy travel career. Nevertheless, some of my tours are not selling as well as I'd hoped, so I'm postponing a few. I hate disappointing people, and apologize for any inconvenience, but I have to concentrate on the tours with the greatest chance of success. Since I am best known for Africa, I will continue to focus most of my attention on that region. Please see pages 3 through 6 for overviews of my current tours.

My two- and three-week tours and safaris are a real bargain when you compare them to, say, a week in the South Pacific's Bora Bora, which costs roughly \$6,000 per person. Or a helicopter trip to a BC fishing lodge, which



can cost even more than that. I recently saw an ad for a seven-day trip to see the polar bears of Churchill, Manitoba, starting at \$8,795 per person. First you have to get to Winnipeg, where the tour starts. Most of my safaris and tours are a steal by comparison, especially when you consider everything that's included.

As you're no doubt aware, I supplement my twice-yearly newsletters with monthly email updates. Make sure you're on my email list, so you don't miss anything! **UPCOMING TOURS**—My January tour of **Botswana & Zambia** is sold out, but you can still sign up for January of 2014. We also get to see species you seldom see anywhere else, such as wild dogs and sable antelope, and we stay in luxurious tented camps.

**New Zealand** holds happy memories for me. I once spent six months there picking fruit, toiling on a sheep farm, and working as a mate on a fish boat in Milford Sound before desperate seasickness forced me to give it up. New Zealand a long way from anywhere, but it has everything you could wish for. It's the most beautiful country on Earth. After admiring the fall colours, you can relax on a Fijian beach for a couple of days. Call **Ernie Balint** at **Collette Vacations** to sign up for our April trip. If you've never been to **Ireland**, why not come with me next summer? It's another place where I have close ties. Skillan is an Irish name, and my dad's dad came from Newry in Ulster. As a young soldier I spent eighteen months at Ballykinlar, a windswept peninsula overlooking the Mountains of Mourne in County Down. I canoed, kayaked, hiked, and climbed whenever I had time. I also went to a dance one Saturday night in Newcastle, a small town across Dundrum Bay, and met my first true love, a beautiful Dublin colleen named Eve. I've never forgotten her. I'm looking forward to our two-week trip to the land of saints, sinners, and scholars, which departs in just eight months.

My October tour of **Kenya and Tanzania** is my most popular tour, and for good reason. It includes some of the most famous places in Africa—the fabled Serengeti, Ngorongoro Crater, Olduvai Gorge, and the Maasai Mara National Reserve, scene of the annual great migration of wildebeest and zebra. In the last few years, **Morocco** has become wildly popular with Europeans, who know a dream destination when they see one. You'll see extraordinary sights, including the cosmopolitan cities of Casablanca, Marrakesh, Fez, Meknes, and Rabat. This exotic Arabian kingdom has one foot in the twenty-first century and the other in antiquity, resulting in a dizzying array of extremes and contrasts. I invite you to join me there next year!

**FUTURE TOURS**—I've listed my proposed tours up to the spring of 2014 on pages 3 through 6. Hopefully, things in Egypt will have settled down by then. One of the most alluring travel destinations on Earth, it always bounces back quickly after it's hit with any bad publicity. Although I haven't yet set dates, I also hope to visit Indo-China, Kenya and Tanzania, and Ethiopia in the fall of 2014.
